→ The following prerequisite courses must be completed by the end of the fall semester (preceding the spring admission evaluation): ENGL 101, CMST 101, CHEM 140a, PSYC 102 (or another prerequisite), and ZOO 118 (or a higher BIOL prerequisite [PHSL 301 or MICR 201]). The remaining prerequisite courses must be completed by the end of the spring semester (preceding the fall admission term): ENGL 102, CHEM 140b, MICR 201 and PHSL 301.

ZOO 118 is the prerequisite course for PHSL 301 and MICR 201 which are taken in the spring semester. If you attended another college and have completed equivalent courses for BOTH PHSL 301 and MICR 201, then you can use one of these courses (in lieu of ZOO 118) for the fall Biology prerequisite requirement. All science courses must be completed within seven years of admission to the program.

Prerequisite courses taken during the summer semester (preceding the fall admission term) will not be considered part of the application for admission. A failed prerequisite course (D, F, or WF grade) may not be repeated more than once to receive a passing grade of C or higher. Applicants will be prioritized on a point value system which reflects completion of the required admission prerequisite courses listed above and any repeats of the required science prerequisite courses. Repeating two separate science prerequisite courses to receive a passing grade (C or higher) will result in a lower admission point value which could affect the applicant's admission status. Prerequisite GPA, including the prerequisite courses taken at SIUE or transfer, must meet or exceed 3.0 on a 4.0 scale with a grade of C or higher in each course. A cumulative GPA from all college level course work must meet or exceed 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. Meeting the stated GPAs does not guarantee admission to the School of Nursing. Please see the SIUE Regional Nursing Program, 0016E SIUC Lindegren Hall, for additional application and retention information.

\* These courses require a grade of C or better.

- 1 ENGL 101 and CMST 101 must be completed during the first 30 hours. ENGL 102 must be completed during the first 45 hours. PHIL 105 and MATH 101 must be completed in the first 60 hours.
- 2 The TEAS nursing admission exam will be required for all applicants. TEAS test information is available at [www.testingservices.siu.edu](http://www.testingservices.siu.edu). The exam covers math, reading comprehension, science, grammar, and vocabulary. Students must score in the “proficient” level to be considered for admission. The exam can be repeated one time only prior to the deadline date (there is a 3 week waiting period before retaking the exam). All fees for the test are non-refundable. If you need to reschedule your test session, you will have to pay the fees again. Specific test dates are typically offered October thru February. - 3 It is recommended that both parts of Anatomy and Physiology be completed at the same institution.
- 4 It is recommended that students choose a course to meet this general education requirement and Global Cultures (EGC). If a course is not selected that meets two general education requirements, then a course from the list of EGC courses in the current SIUE Undergraduate Catalog or CougarNet must also be taken or an approved project or activity must be completed to meet this requirement.

#### General Education Notes:

- Students will complete the Health Experience (EH) and the US Cultures Experience (EUSC) as part of the nursing major requirements.

**Declaring into Pre-Nursing Status:** To declare Pre-Nursing as your secondary, it is necessary to:

1. Have completed all Academic Development courses required by the University;
2. Have completed any required courses to address high school deficiencies; and
3. Be in good standing.
4. Declare a primary major with pre-nursing as your secondary major.

- **Submit the School of Nursing application by March 1.** Nursing applications are accepted September 15—March 1. Applications are available from the SIUE Regional Nursing Program office in Lindegren Hall—office 0013. Submit completed application to the SIUE Regional Nursing Program office in Lindegren Hall—office 0013 or to SIUE Regional Nursing, 0016E Lindegren Hall, 600 Agriculture Drive—MC 6528, Carbondale, IL 62901.
- **Complete the ATI TEAS exam by March 1.** Register for the exam at [www.testingservices.siu.edu](http://www.testingservices.siu.edu)
